

IMAGE AND TEXT:

Artists such as Barbra Kruger and Tom Phillips have been combining images and text into unique pieces of art for decades. The idea or narrative of the work is often the most important aspect. This is called Conceptualism and is a movement that started in New York in the 1960's. These, conceptual artists have a political, religious, or gender based message. They often use images that are the opposite (juxtaposition) of the text. They use humour, irony, wit and sometimes try to shock their audience.



Things to do.

Make a mind map of your research noting dislikes and like, showing how the work of the chosen artists could relate to your life.

Write out a list of issues that affect your life, summarise these issues in a single statement. Write out a list of images that enhance these comments.

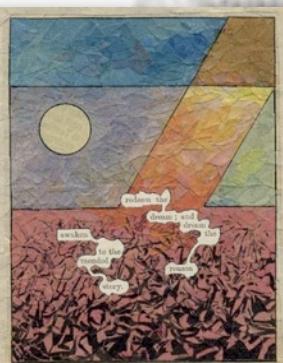
Buy a teen magazine, Broadsheet newspaper, and Tabloid. Tear out all the interesting stories and present them in your sketchbook in an artistic fashion.
